Our History

2012

BHRC began as Blackhawk Hills Resource Conservation and Development District in 1974. In 1992, the federal Economic Development Administration designated BHRC as an Economic Development District. Then in 2012, with the support of the region's county boards and soil and water conservation districts. Blackhawk Hills. a 501(c)(3), was recognized as Northwest Illinois' regional planning organization.

Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS)

BHRC creates, maintains, and helps to implement the six-county region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) and the work of the Economic Development District (EDD). Since the district's inception, the Economic Development Administration (EDA) has awarded around \$15 million in funding to local initiatives. In 2019, after working with the Regional CEDS Committee, BHRC Board, and other stakeholders, we submitted the latest CEDS to EDA for approval. The planning document, which reaches out to 2024, covers key issues, such as declining population, an aging workforce, cluster diversification, and quality of life.

Trail Use & Wayfinding

BHRC has completed an initial study of the region's trails, including the Galena River (Jo Daviess County), Great River (Carroll and Whiteside counties), Jane Addams (Stephenson County), Joe Stengel (Ogle and Lee counties), Lowell Parkway (Lee County), Sterling Multi-Activity Recreational (Whiteside County), and Hennepin Feeder Canal (Whiteside County) trails. During the study, we counted users and launched nwiltrails.org, a repository of information about our region's trails that features data, photos, videos, and interactive maps. IDOT continued to support us in 2019 in two additional (and still ongoing) efforts - an expansion of the trail user study and the development of a common wayfinding guidebook for the trails of Northwest Illinois.

Development & Technical Assistance

BHRC administers the enterprise zone program in Lee and Ogle counties, offering mapping and technical assistance services and business retention and expansion support. In 2018, we helped economic development organizations nominate local Census tracts to be selected as opportunity zones. Additionally, we continue to support iFiber, the not-for-profit 1Gbps fiber network, which serves many communities in the region (ifiber.org/interactive-map). BHRC's broadband work includes helping connect private and public sector organizations to iFiber through its ISP partners.

Freight & Transportation

Two notable projects resulting from the Bi-State/Eight-County Freight Study relate to road safety and port/intermodal facilities. First, in 2018, following a request from BHRC and the East Central Intergovernmental Association (ECIA) to the Illinois Secretary of Transportation, IDOT District 2 conducted a road safety assessment (RSA) of the US 20 corridor between East Dubuque and Freeport. The RSA identified a number of corridor issues, as well as approaches to address each safety item identified. Additionally, in early 2019, BHRC began to work with ECIA, Northwest Illinois Economic Development, businesses, and other partners to pick a consultant to start a Mississippi River port planning project. Proponents are focused on roll-on/roll-off, break bulk, and project cargo. The feasibility study will include a benefit-cost analysis, which will reveal whether investment is warranted, and a market study, which will identify interested shippers and forecast use of an upgraded facility.

2018 Annual Meeting


